



# Community Support: Conferences

## MAJOR INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES

### RubyConf

<http://www.rubyconf.org>

This is the premier event for the Ruby language community and is run by Ruby Central itself in the late fall. It has been operating since 2001 and is usually moved to a different city in the US each year. Attendance is typically limited to less than 500.

### RailsConf

<http://en.oreilly.com/rails2009>

The largest event in the Ruby & Rails Ecosystem. It is put on as a partnership between Ruby Central and O'Reilly Media. In 2009, the fourth such conference was held. Attendance was down due to the world economic downturn but was still substantial with 1,300 attendees. This event also has a large number of sponsors that display in an exhibit area.

### RailsConf Europe

This event was also held as a partnership between Ruby Central and O'Reilly Media. It was held for several years, usually in Berlin, Germany, in the early fall, but was suspended in 2009 due to the economic downturn. Several regional conferences in Europe stepped up to fill the void (see below).






